

**DGC-Coordinated Project Reviews  
Statistics on How Long it Takes DGC to Review Projects<sup>1</sup>  
(Data is from Past 5 years)**

- (1) average length of 50 day review (with extensions): = 53.2 days
- (2) average length of 30 day review (with extensions) = 28.2 days
- (3) Per cent of reviews extended at request of applicant = 38 %
- (4) Per cent of reviews extended by DGC due to "complex project"= 5 %
- (5) Number of oil and gas projects in the North Slope that have taken more than a year in ACMP review = No consistency review has taken more than a year.
- (6) Number of oil and gas projects in the North Slope that have taken more than 6 months in ACMP review = 1 consistency review more than 6 months.
- (7) Number of mining projects that have taken more than 50 days to review = 8
- (8) Number of mining projects that have taken more than 6 months to review = 0
- (9) Number of mining projects that have taken more than a year to review = 0
